Hanwell Community Centre Update

Earlier this year Conservative-controlled Ealing Council saved the Hanwell Community Centre.

Over many years the building had decayed and urgent repairs were needed to ensure that future generations could enjoy it.

The Council pledged £2m for urgent repairs and to turn it into a community centre fit for the 21st Century.

We can now report that work will start on site in March 2009 and should be completed and handed back to the community by February 2010.
