The Audit Commission has confirmed what most residents of Perivale realised long ago: under this incompetent Labour Council, Ealing’s streets are among the dirtiest in London, and Ealing is the fourth dirtiest borough in the city.

Conservatives have pledged to deal with this problem in a number of ways, including:

- ✓ Committing an extra £7.8million to the environment budget over the next four years.
- ✓ Introducing ‘Showcase Streets’ across Perivale.
- ✓ Sweeping each street and removing all litter at least once a week.

However, Perivale’s Conservatives have pledged not only to deal with the graffiti and litter that pollute our neighbourhoods, but also to deal with cracked pavements, poor street lighting and potholes that are the symptom of Labour’s underinvestment in our environment and transport network..

A Conservative run Ealing Council will double the number of roads being resurfaced every year.

Defending the Conservative’s proposals, Peter Allott said that “Improving the quality of our roads and pavements will make Perivale a safer and more pleasant place to live and work.”

Conservatives pledge action on fly tipping

Local Conservatives have pledged to deal with the problem of fly tipping in Perivale and across the borough.

Conservative candidate Edmond Yeo said, “No street or alleyway should be used as a dumping ground. **A Conservative Council will remove all fly tipped waste within 24 hours and prosecute offenders.**”

In particular, Conservatives have pledged to work with local superstore Tesco to try and ensure that trolleys are not taken from their premises and that any trolleys left lying around Perivale are speedily removed.

Conservative candidate Peter Allott said, “These trolleys represent not only a safety hazard to pedestrians and drivers but are a real eyesore.”

Conservatives promise tough action against illegal car traders and mechanics

Like other areas in the borough, parts of Perivale are plagued by people illegally selling, and repairing, cars on public highways.

Conservatives have condemned Labour-run Ealing Council for not dealing with this problem effectively and for failing to prosecute offenders.

Conservative candidate Clifford Pile said that “Illegal traders not only harm those businesses that operate within the law, they also occupy the parking spaces needed by local traders, particularly in the Bilton Road

Conservatives condemn Labour's legacy of failure

Despite massive rises in council tax (including the 25.9% rise in 2003), events over the past year demonstrate that Ealing's Labour-run Council is crippled by incompetence and waste:

Uncollected council tax. Whilst most of Perivale's residents struggle to pay ever larger council tax bills, the GMB union claimed that in 2004/05 Ealing Council failed to collect £7million of council tax, making it the seventh worst out of 351 local authorities in England.

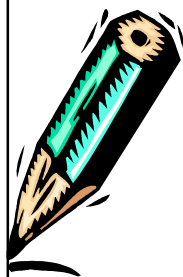
Failed court case. Ealing Council wasted hundreds of thousands of pounds of tax payers money trying to overturn a negative judgement by the Audit Commission.

Licensing Act chaos. Ealing Council failed to apply for licences for its own halls in Ealing, Acton and Greenford. The council has had to pay £12,157.25 in compensation because of this failure.

Dirty streets. A report by the Audit Commission said that Ealing was the fourth dirtiest borough in London. This is despite massive council tax rises and frequent pledges of action from the Labour-controlled Ealing Council.

And the Lib Dems?

Given that Lib Dem councillors are the worst attendees at Council meetings, they're clearly not that bothered by the condition of Ealing. However, to be fair, they did turn up to vote for the increases in council tax!
