## CONSERVATIVES CONDEMN LABOUR'S 'WASTEFUL' BUDGET

*Council Tax now 48% higher than it was in 2002*

*Average home now pays £424 more per year than in 2002*

Perivale Conservatives have condemned another round of Labour Council Tax increases. Conservative candidate **Peter Allott** said, "No one objects to paying money for quality services, but twelve years of Labour rule in Ealing have led to record increases in Council Tax whilst Perivale and the rest of the borough continue to suffer from graffiti, crime, lack of investment in our transport infrastructure and the shameful neglect of our public spaces."

**The Conservatives proposed this year to limit Ealing's share of the Council Tax increase to just 1.9% by preventing more than £1.8 million of wasteful spending.**

**Conservatives are committed to spending an additional £7.8 million on environmental priorities.** These include:

- ✓ Clearing up all graffiti on public property.
- ✓ Free garden waste recycling
- ✓ Improved street cleaning
- ✓ Improved maintenance of public spaces.

## *PERIVALE TO HAVE FIRST 'SHOWCASE STREET'*

Perivale Conservatives are committed to completely renovating the whole of Perivale, beginning with the Medway Estate.

Perivale Conservatives have announced that when they take control of Ealing Council after the May elections, the Medway Estate will be the first area of the borough to be upgraded to 'Showcase Street' status.

Explaining the Conservative's plans, candidate **Edmond Yeo** said, "Our plans to improve the Medway Estate will be carried out in consultation with local residents. The services that the areas normally receive will continue as normal but the area will, in a short space of time, be completely renewed so as to allow for a new beginning after years of Labour neglect. It's what people pay their Council Tax for and it is what they deserve."

'Showcase Street' status is designed to give the areas of the borough neglected by Labour a fresh start and it includes:

- ✓ **Upgrading all street lighting.**
- ✓ **Ensuring 'crack free' pavements**
- ✓ **New road surfaces**
- ✓ **Removal of graffiti and litter**
- ✓ **Properly pruned trees**
- ✓ **Action to eliminate rats and other vermin**
- ✓ **New waste disposal system**
- ✓ **Brand new street signs denoting 'Showcase status'.**

Once the scheme has been completed we will ask local residents to give us their feedback and we will work with the Perivale Area Committee to identify further 'Showcase Street' projects in all areas of Perivale.

Conservative candidate **Clifford Pile** said, "Many areas of the borough need a fresh start. Twelve years of Labour's neglect of Perivale has meant that ongoing maintenance is simply not going to be enough to return it to its former glory. Once the Medway Estate has been given 'Showcase Street' status we will ensure that it is properly maintained."

Our ultimate aim is to use the Showcase Streets programme to enable Ealing to become a Showcase Borough and once again enjoy the reputation of being 'Queen of the Suburbs'.

## ***CONSERVATIVES WELCOME MORE POLICE FOR PERIVALE***

Perivale Conservatives have welcomed the news that Perivale is to be allocated more Police officers and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs).

Conservative candidate **Peter Allott** said, “Conservatives have been campaigning for years to get more police on the streets and it is good that something is happening at last.”

However, Conservatives have criticised the delay in allocating more Police to Perivale, pointing out that wards such as Southall already have the recommended 6 officers whilst Perivale was still undermanned.

Conservative candidate **Clifford Pile** said “Perivale residents pay as much in Council Tax as other people in the borough, and it is not fair



that Perivale is having to wait longer.”

Upon taking control of Ealing Council after the 4th May, Conservatives are committed to expanding the Street Warden scheme across the borough and to effectively use ASBOs and CCTV to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour in Perivale and across the borough.

## ***DIRTIEST STREETS IN LONDON AND GRAFFITI OUT OF CONTROL***

A recent report from the independent Audit Commission has revealed that the borough of Ealing has some of the dirtiest streets and open places in London. Of the 33 London boroughs, Ealing came fourth from bottom, despite having some of the highest costs for cleaning per person.

Perivale Conservative candidate **Edmond Yeo**, said, “What this report basically says is that we all pay a lot compared to other boroughs to receive one of the worst services

in London. This is hardly surprising because we can see it every day in our own streets.”

Fellow candidate **Clifford Pile** added, “The Conservatives will spend an additional £7.8 million improving our local environment. This will mean more money for getting rid of all the graffiti which Ealing Council has failed to tackle as well as ensuring that streets are cleaned better. Residents have suffered massive increases in Council Tax and its time the service improved.”
