## **CONSERVATIVES WIN IN PERIVALE**

**Ealing has its first Tory council in twelve years**

Thanks to the support of the people of Perivale, the three Conservative candidates have been elected as councillors for Perivale. This is the first time since 1994 that Perivale has been represented by Conservatives.

Defying the predictions of many, the Conservatives also took control of Ealing Council, delivering the first Conservative controlled administration since 1994.

Perivale Councillor **Cllr Clifford Pile** said: "The people of Perivale grew tired of the high taxes and poor service that marked Labour's years in power. This was a vote for change and we will ensure that our promises are fulfilled."

The result in Perivale saw one of the highest turnouts in the borough (42%). **Cllr Allott** commented that: "The high turnout is a tribute to the vigorous campaigns fought by ourselves and our Labour counterparts. It shows that voters do care about local politics since they recognise that what the council does or doesn't do affects them directly."

The Liberal Democrats, who neglected to fight a campaign in Perivale and didn't even bother to turn up to the vote, lost 1 of their 4 seats so that the political make-up of the Council is now:

Conservatives: 37 (+20)

Labour: 29 (-19)

Liberal Democrats: 3 (-1)

### **Conservative action since taking office:**

- 1) Ealing's new Conservative Council has removed the Council's support for the West London Tram.**
- 2) The pink garden recycling bags are to be made free from November 2006.**
- 3) Recycling of cardboard in the green plastic boxes will begin in November.**
- 4) From September 2006 the council will clean all graffiti on public property and remove all flytipping from public property with 24 hours of it being reported.**
- 5) A reduction in the price of 'Meals on Wheels' from £3 to £2.50.**
- 6) Free car-parking in council car parks from 6pm and public holidays. A 4year freeze on CPZ permit charges.**

Perivale's new Conservative councillors welcomed the formal launch of Perivale's new Safer Neighbourhood Team. The team's two police officers and one Community Support officer were are a dedicated policing team for Perivale. **Cllr Pile** welcomed then saying: "We are very pleased to have such dedicated officers working in Perivale and we are committed to doing everything we can to eliminate crime and anti-social behaviour. We hope that the full compliment of six officers will materialise in the near future."

Perivale Conservatives have already take action to deal with crime by announcing their support for additional CCTV along Bilton Road and, where there is local demand, an extension of alley gating.

## TORIES PLEDGE TO STOP TRAM

---

The long-running Conservative campaign to stop Labour's Ken Livingstone's West London Tram was given a great boost by the first meeting of the new Council. The Conservative controlled Council voted to stop spending tax payers money on supporting the tram and to begin to oppose it. Perivale Conservatives supported to stopping of the tram because the large amount of money it would cost, the disruption to traffic and the increase in pollution it would cause. After the meeting **Cllr Yeo** said: "The people of Ealing have never wanted the tram and rather than insisting he will carry on regardless, London's Labour Mayor must start to listen." Since the decision by Ealing Council, it has already been revealed that the Labour's Ken Livingstone has so far spent £23 million on the Tram.



In the first Perivale Area Committee meeting since the election, the three new Conservative councillors for Perivale voted to order a wide ranging review of the traffic situation in Perivale to try and find ways in which the flow of traffic can be improved.

# QUEEN OF THE SUBURBS TO GET HER CROWN BACK

## Conservatives announce an increase in spending on the environment

---

The new Conservative Council has announced that an additional £400,000 is to be immediately spent on clearing up graffiti and fly tipping from around Perivale. From September, any graffiti on council owned property or fly tipping on public land will be cleared within 24 hours of it being reported. **Cllr Pile** welcomed the news saying: "We promised to take action to deal with these two problems and this is the beginning of our fight against graffiti and fly tipping. We will also work closely with the police and local residents to catch and prosecute those who commit these crimes."

The council has also announced that from November the council will be accepting cardboard in the green boxes. Eventually, plastics will also be accepted in the green boxes meaning that the vast majority of household waste in Ealing will be able to be recycled. In addition to this, the Council has also announced that from October 2006, the pink garden recycling bags will be free and that in the next year or so it is hoped to replace them with a free reusable bag.

As promised, Perivale councillors are working with Tesco's to deal with the problem of abandoned trolleys and the recycling area at the Perivale store.

# COUNCIL GIVES GO-AHEAD TO REBUILD TWO PERIVALE SCHOOLS

The new Conservative Council has voted to provide the funding needed to rebuild St John Fisher Primary School and Perivale Primary School. This decision is the result of many years of lobbying from local politicians, residents and the schools themselves.

**Cllr Edmond Yeo** welcomed the news of the rebuild saying: "This decisions represents our commitment to ensuring the highest standards of education for all of our children. In particular, this massive investment by central government and Ealing Council will deliver the 21st century facilities that the children of Perivale deserve. It also shows the fruit of some welcome co-operation between central and local government and between the main political parties."
