



ACTION TO CUT SPEEDING ALONG BILTON ROAD



At the November meeting of the Perivale Area Committee, the three Conservative councillors agreed to spend £9000 to develop traffic calming measures along Bilton Road. The measures will include additional road signage plus speed activated variable message signs and should be in place by Easter.

Cllr Edmond Yeo said: “Speeding along Bilton Road has been a problem for a long time and it has been ignored for too long. We will work closely with the police and other partners to address this problem. We hope that these new measures will go some way to addressing the problem.”

TORIES DELIVER LOWEST COUNCIL TAX RISE IN OVER A DECADE

Ealing’s new Conservative Council has delivered on its pledge to keep council tax low by announcing that the borough element will rise by only 1.9%, lower than the rate of inflation and the lowest increase since 1993 (when the Tories last controlled Ealing). At the same time the Tories announced an increase in investment on

street cleaning and measures to tackle crime. **Cllr Peter Allott** said “We have started to eliminate the waste that marks Labour misrule. This shows that it is possible to improve services and keep tax low by making services more efficient. Labour’s massive increases in tax went to fund waste and not services. Those days are over.”

TORIES MAKE MASSIVE INVESTMENT IN MEDWAY ESTATE

Just eight months after Perivale elected its three new Conservative councillors, the clean-up of the Medway estate has been completed.

As promised in our manifesto, the new Conservative council has dedicated over £60,000 to reversing the decline of the Medway estate after twelve years of Labour neglect. The Conservative councillors also announced that a further £42,000 would be spent on the Medway Estate in order to provide all of the alley ways with gating. **Cllr Clifford Pile** commented on the massive investment in the Medway saying: “These measures show that we are a party that follows through on the promises we made at the election. They will make the Medway Estate cleaner and safer and enhance the lives of all of the residents of the estate. Voting Tory really does make a difference.”



The investment in the Medway estate was opposed by Labour councillors who claimed that the money should have been spent elsewhere in the borough.

Cllr Peter Allott rejected the Labour demands saying: “Once again, Labour is neglecting Perivale for other areas of the borough. Do they never learn? This is an important step in making Ealing once again the Queen of the suburbs.”

The improvements to the Medway have included:

- Rerouting the E5 bus
- Resurfacing the Medway Parade
- A new roundabout on the Parade
- Replacing many broken paving stones.
- Repainting all lamp posts
- Removing all graffiti
- New street signs
