POST OFFICES FACE CLOSURE

PERIVALE- 1 YEAR ON

Perivale Conservatives have been celebrating their first year in office. **Cllr PETER ALLOTT** said, “People sometimes say that voting doesn’t make a difference since all of the parties are the same. CONSERVATIVE ACHIEVEMENTS SO FAR

In the past year the new Conservative Council has:

- Delivered the lowest council tax increase in 12 years.
- Spent nearly £100,000 on the Medway Showcase Streets and alley-gating project.
- Abolished Labour’s charges for pink bags-these are now free.
- Introduced cardboard recycling.
- Cut the price of ‘meals on wheels’ by 17%.
- Agreed funding for 50 extra PCSOs to combat crime.
- Introduced the clearing of graffiti and fly-tipping on public property within 24 hours of it being reported.
- Reversed Labour’s support for Ken Livingstone’s tram.
- Increased the amount spent resurfacing roads from £500,000 p.a. a year ago to £3.5 million this year (including Leaver Gardens in Perivale).
- Approved funding for the rebuilding of St John Fisher and Perivale Primary schools.
- Spent £14,000 on measures to cut speeding along Bilton Road.
- Spent £5,000 on environmental improvements to the Lily Gardens estate.
- Completed alley-gating projects in Rydal Crescent and Tavistock Avenue.
- Introduced a 100 new apprenticeships.

TORIES TO INTRODUCE RECYCLING OF PLASTICS

The new Conservative Council has announced that from November, Perivale residents will be able to recycle plastic in their green boxes (with the exception of toys and garden furniture). Also from November, residents' ordinary waste and recycled waste will both be collected on the same day, rather than separate days as at present.

Cllr ALLOTT, the Deputy Portfolio Holder for the Environment, welcomed the improvement to services saying, "It is vital that we all recycle as much as we can and the council is determined to make this as easy as possible." The news follows the decision of Perivale residents to reject wheelie bins in favour of the current system.



From November residents will be able to recycle paper, plastics, textiles and cardboard in their green boxes. Food waste should also be recycled so as to prevent black sacks from being torn up and so discourage vermin.

MORE ALLEY-GATING INSTALLED IN FIGHT AGAINST CRIME

TAVISTOCK AVE & RYDAL CRESCENT ARE LATEST BENEFICIARIES

Two more alley-gating projects have been completed in Perivale since the last edition of *Perivale First*. Tavistock Avenue and Rydal Crescent have both had alley-gating installed in response to requests from residents. **Cllr EDMOND YEO** said, "We were elected on a commitment to support alley-gating where there is local demand. We have spent a lot of money on measures to make our streets safer and alley-gating is one good way of keeping homes secure and preventing illegal fly tipping. I know there are other streets who may want alley-gating and we will be working with residents to deliver this over the next few years."
