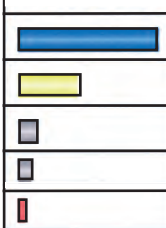

### A THANK YOU MESSAGE FROM TIM KNIGHT

Thank you, to everyone who voted for me on 4th June in the Hampshire County Council Elections for Fareham Crofton.

Crofton achieved the highest voter turnout in Fareham at 46.36% and thanks to everyone's tremendous support I achieved the highest single division vote of any Councillor at over 3,000 votes.

I originally stood to preserve open space. Since then I have fully supported environmental issues and now the priority is to reduce needless and costly bureaucracy.

I am grateful to those residents who discussed local issues with me on their doorsteps and at our surgeries.

It enables you, to tell me what you want, and lets me explain what I do. I am also a Fareham Borough Councillor and do my best to champion your needs.

Following the Election Tim was elected by the County Council at the Annual Council Meeting to be Chairman of Hampshire County Council. Tim is seen here greeting a schoolgirl from Belarus who was part of a group visiting Hampshire. It is estimated that more than 2 million people in Belarus are still affected by radiation from Chernobyl and that a one month stay in Britain may well extend the children's life expectancy by an extra two years.

### The late Helen Deakin Memorial

Our sincere thanks go to the Stubbington Traders, Crofton Lions, The Stubbington Fayre Committee, local churches and most of all our residents who have generously donated £2,379.01 to be used for the creation of a memorial to Helen Deakin who did so much for our village.

The money will be used to fund a park bench on the village green for rest and reflection, a waste bin to remind us to continue her work of 'Keeping Stubbington Tidy' and a liquid amber tree. Any surplus will be donated to the RSPCA Ark which was one of her favourite charities.

The Crofton Community Centre management committee also intend to pay tribute to her by dedicating the central grassed area at the Centre to her.

## 2 Hill Head and Stubbington Conservatives

### Hammond Memorial Hall Trust

Work on the new Hammond Wing of the Community Centre is well on the way to completion, with the opening ceremony scheduled for 11 September.

Fareham Borough Council has agreed to a draft scheme in which the control of the charity, which still holds the proceeds from the old Hall disposal, will be vested in a committee of seven trustees to be elected annually by Fareham Borough Council.

This will include the four local Councillors for Stubbington and Hill Head and is consistent with the original conveyance.



### Burnt House Lane traffic regulation proposals

The Traffic Regulation proposals to help remedy parking problems in Burnt House Lane are on the way and should be published by the end of the July. This is a consultation process and an opportunity for you to comment, should you so wish.

### Daedalus Planning Consultation

The next stage of consultation for the part of the Daedalus site that is within Fareham Borough will be through the Fareham Core Strategy. This document identifies Daedalus as a Strategic Site for development and sets out in a policy the general terms under which development would be permitted. If agreed by Council Members in September, consultation is expected to take place during October and November.

Meanwhile progress is being made on preparation of the draft Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) for the Daedalus site by the South East England Development Agency (SEEDA) and its consultants. This consultation document will provide more detail to guide decisions on planning applications. This is expected to commence in November, but may be delayed. More time may be needed for additional work to assess the impact on the strategic gap and also on the road network surrounding the site. Anyone interested is therefore well advised to check on the Council's website for timetable updates.
