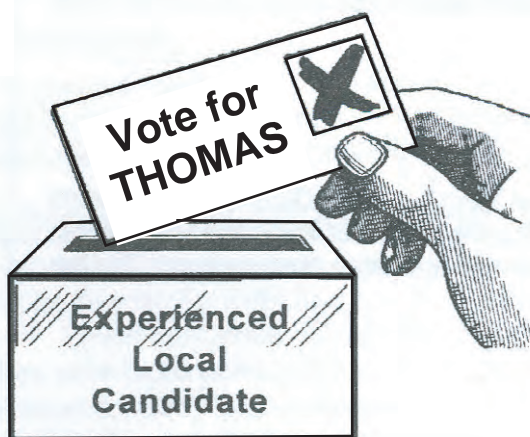

About Chris Thomas – the Stubbington Conservative candidate

Born and raised near Cardiff, secondary education was at Barry Grammar Technical School where both O and A levels were taken. Further education was at Loughborough University studying Aeronautical Engineering. Following University, he spent 4 ½ years in the hovercraft industry and returned to Loughborough University in 1969 to carry out research into hovercraft stability and control under a Ministry of Technology contract. This led to the award of a Ph.D. in 1972.



He then spent the next 24 years in the Navy doing 2 tours of duty at Daedalus, the latter one as Training Commander and, for six months, combined it with the post of Executive Officer. His final Naval post was in the Second Sea Lord's Department based in Portsmouth Dockyard. Retiring from the Navy in 1996, he took up the post of Bursar at West Hill Park School in Titchfield where he remained until February last year (2005).

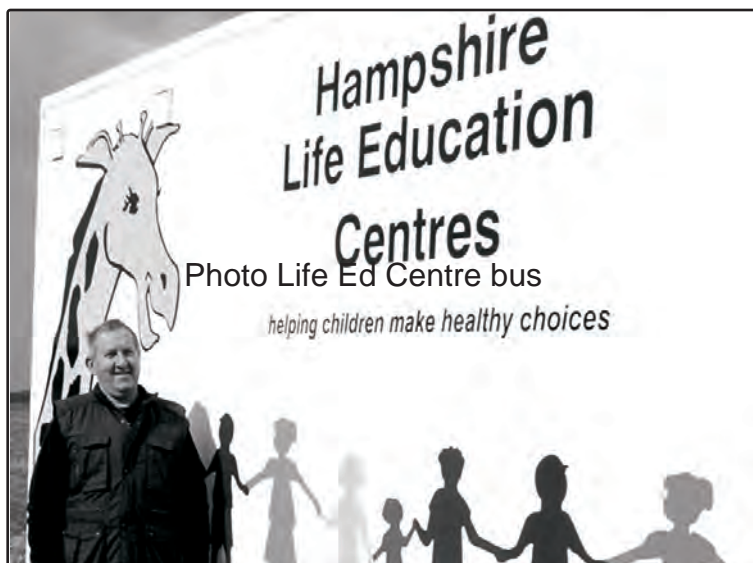
With his wife Marion, he moved to Stubbington in 1973 and, apart from a few years away living in married quarters, they have kept their home here. Both of their boys were educated in the Crofton Schools, belonged to 1st Stubbington Scouts, before they moved on to University and beyond! Marion is an active member and past President of Crofton WI and was Chairman of the old Ferneham Group for many years. She is regularly involved in the flower arrangements in Crofton Old Church. In recent years, she has

been a keen bowler both indoors and out until "dodgy" knees prevented her playing. They are both more readily known in the neighbourhood through their miniature schnauzer, Max!!

Always a keen gardener and model railway enthusiast, his main leisure activity throughout his life has been rugby (what else from a Welshman!) initially as a player, later as a referee for Hampshire, being Chairman of the Hampshire Society for several years, and achieving the RFU Panel of Referees.

Now retired from active participation in the sport, most of his energy is concentrated on Fareham Rotary Club. He was honoured with the Presidency in 2002-2003 and now runs their "Wheelhouse" in Salterns Road.

Other part-time tasks, which keep him busy, are as Trustee and Treasurer of Life Education Centres (Hampshire), Trustee and Chairman of the finance committee of Price's Trust in Fareham, and as the Clerk to the Governors of Swanmore College.



Methods of Voting

Voters may now cast their votes in a number of different ways

POSTAL VOTING is available to electors without the need for a reason to be given. If you have already applied for a permanent postal vote there is no need to reapply. If you elected for a postal vote for one election only, you will need to reapply. New applications to vote by post or to change instructions to existing absent vote details e.g. cancellation, redirection etc must be submitted to the Election Office by:

5pm on 18 April 2006

Postal votes are expected to be issued on
Friday 21 April

PROXY VOTING is available for physical incapacity or blindness; for occupation, service, employment, or attendance on a course; or to persons registered as a service voter, an overseas elector, a mental patient or remand prisoner.

New applications must be submitted by:

5pm on 25 April 2006

New proxy vote applications may be made in the circumstances of unforeseen medical emergency (which must be attested by a medical practitioner) up to the day of the poll.

You can still be really old fashioned and visit the polling station on election day
