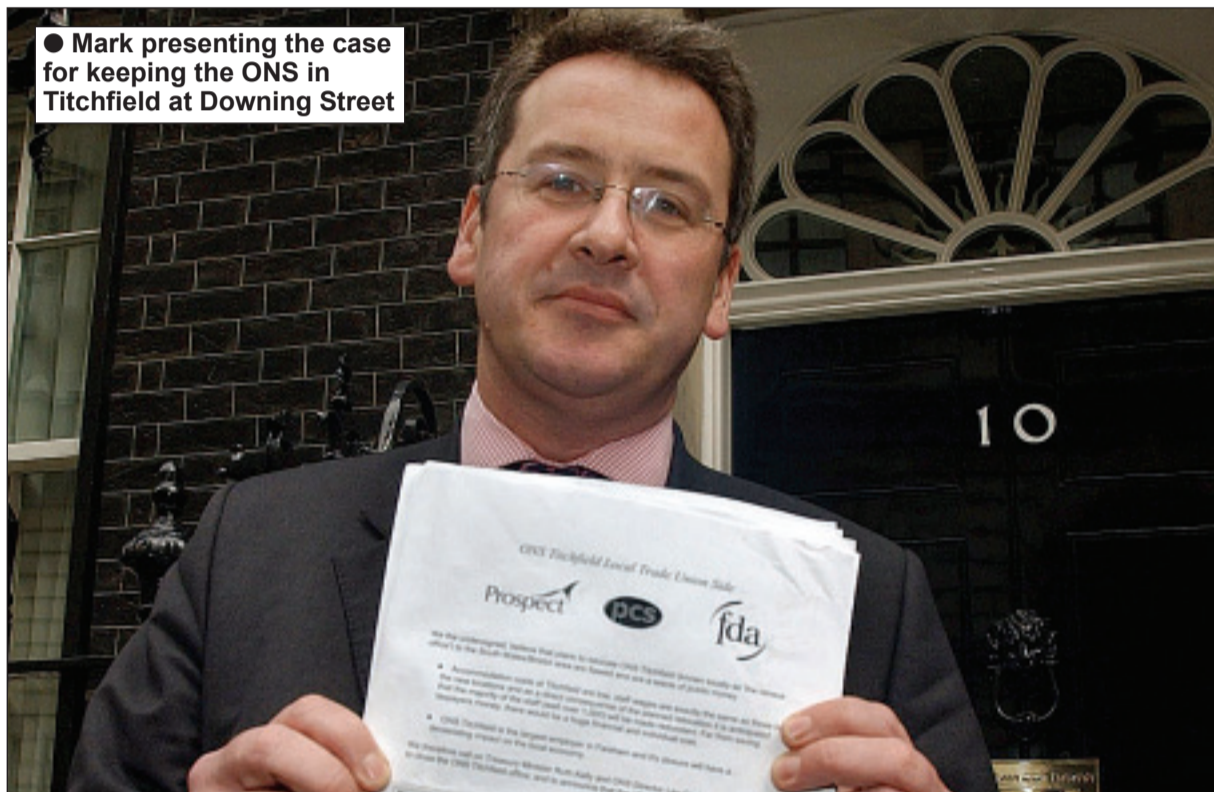
Mark Hoban - a record of achievement
