

ACTION in Sarisbury, Park Gate & Whiteley

Having been a Councillor for Sarisbury (which until 2002 included most of Park Gate Ward) for 19 years and Leader of Fareham Borough Council for 6 years Cllr Seán Woodward knows the area well and has a good record of getting things done, never failing to take up and respond to every issue taken to him.

Cllr Seán Woodward says, if elected I will:-
