TONY'S CONTRACT WITH THE PEOPLE OF WEST SHOEBURY

If elected as your local councillor on 6th May:

1. I will always stand up for our community and put West Shoebury first.

Sometimes, you have to choose between what is right for West Shoebury and party loyalty - and I will always choose what is best for West Shoebury.

2. I will always reply to all residents emails, telephone calls, letters and hold ward surgeries.

From time to time I will host the popular street surgeries in a variety of locations across the ward away from the traditional monthly surgery at Thorpedene Community Centre

3. I will oppose any planning application for more takeaways in West Shoebury.

4. I will report all broken paving stones, pot holes and street lights promptly.

5. I will campaign for better street lighting in some of the most poorly light roads.

6. I will fight for further investment in Shoeburyness Leisure Centre.

7. I will work hard for further investment in Shoeburyness High School.
